From the Desk of Town Supervisor (Pat Flynn):

- The Town of Torrey has contracted with Municipal Solutions in conjunction with the ongoing work for Water District #1.
- Received from the Village of Dresden an analysis prepared by Municipal Solution regarding water rates for Water District #2. The analysis has been passed on to the Town Water Committee.
- Jeremy DeLyser, engineer with CPL, attended December 10,2019 meeting to provide a progress report on Water District #1 since the signing of a contract with CPL on December 12,2018. Jeremy outlined the process from obtaining easements through the actual start of construction. He will provide the Town Board with a written description of the specific steps and time frame for their completion.
- Signed a number of documents for submission to the Department of Health, Department of Agriculture, Department of Environmental Conservation, and Norfolk Southern Railway on behalf of Water District 1.

- Town Office is open Monday through Thursday from 9:00am 4:00pm. Call 315-536- 6376
- Tax Collection is in full stride, the new collection system introduced by the county in 2018 was plagued with glitches, the problems have been resolved, and the 2020 tax collection is running smoothly.
- This year, on the tax bills is the option to pay Town & County Taxes online at https://www.yatescounty.org/519, standard processing fees will be applied.
- Fee collection such as building permits, fines & fees issued by Code Office
- Licenses : marriage, hunting, fishing, dog & birth/death certificates (If you love your dog(s), please license them. Licensing helps with Identification of lost dogs and provides protection for the community. It is also NYS Ag & Market law- ALL dogs harbored in the Town of Torrey must be licensed *yearly* at the Town Clerk office).

From the Desk of Town Highway Superintendent (*Tim Chambers*):

- Mowing for 2019 was completed just in time as Winter came early with sanding and plowing starting November 7th.
- The side mower is attached on the town excavator to clean up banks along the roadways
- An engineer is being consulted about a problem on East Leach Road
- Sought quotes for a replacement for the 6 wheel truck #4 which were presented at the December 10,2019 Town Board meeting

- As a **safety** precaution, especially this time of year when snow plowing is possible, trash cans should **not** be placed on Town Roads,but rather on the right-of-way.
- Reminder according to NYS law:
 - + throwing trash, garbage, rubbish, litter or refuse on Highways and adjacent lands is <u>prohibited</u>
 - the town superintendent of highways shall sue for and recover a penalty not to exceed \$100 from any person depositing ashes, snow, ice, stones, sticks, etc. upon a highway or on grass or loose stones adjoining a town highway

- Town Court is applying for a **JCAP** Grant to finance installation of a Security system for the building and court room.

From the Desk of Town Watershed Inspector (*Yates Cty Soil & Water***)** The Town's inspectors can be contacted at the Yates County Soil and Water Conservation Department 315- 536-5188. In November of 2014, the Town of Torrey passed a local Wastewater Law effective January 1, 2015. Under the new law, any onsite wastewater treatment system within 200' of Seneca Lake or a DEC classified stream is required to be inspected every 5 years. The cost of the inspection is borne by the Town of Torrey (unless this is a property transfer). However any pumping of the septic or repair is a cost to the homeowner. We are now in year 5 of these inspections.

Upcoming Community Event

Seneca Lake Pure Waters Association (SLPWA)
 Stream sampling along the Keuka Outlet continued in 2019 with results similar to previous years.
 Sampling will continue in 2020, but may be adjusted to account for data needs for the Seneca Watershed 9 Element Plan.

2019 was another big year for Harmful Algal Blooms on Seneca Lake, which were found not only in September, but well into October this year. The shoreline north of the Outlet was very susceptible again.

A dock monitoring and sampling experiment proved very promising. It demonstrated we can find more blooms than with just volunteers and that there is significant nutrient variation along the shoreline. We hope to be able to continue this program in 2020.

In addition, Pure Waters would like to focus research on HAB toxins, to understand when it is safe to go back in the water, but will need to find funding to do so. One part of this toxin research, would be to test a toxin field test kit that homeowners could use to test their own water for the presence of toxins.
